Also check your emails on a Friday as each teacher will be sending out a super squirrel postcard to the parents of a child who has really impressed them that week. We will give the child a paper copy, sharing the reasons why it was sent with the whole school, the following Monday.

We also celebrate the class who has won the attendance trophy for the best whole class attendance the previous week and which class has won the race to read. This is where we see which class has read the most times at home, through counting the number of times they have read during the previous week from their reading records. The winning class each half term gets to choose a new fiction and non fiction book for their class library.
