



Great Hockham Primary School & Nursery – Sports Premium Plan September 2020 – July 2021

Objectives

- To raise staff confidence in the delivery of high quality PE and school sport sessions so that children are engaged in regular physical activity each day.
- To raise the profile of PE and school sport and see it as a central part of school improvement.
- To make use of specialist coaches to deliver sessions alongside staff so that the staff are up-skilled and children experience different sports
- To increase staff awareness of and ability to assess children against the new curriculum and NC objectives
- To enable children from across the school to participate in regular intra and inter school sports events (from Spring Term – Covid-19 permitting)
- To celebrate all PE and sports events with the local community via the school website, local and Parish News
- To create a sustainable improvement to the schools PE provision and be able to account for the use of the money

Background

– from Sept '17 the DfE increased Sports Premium to (£16000 plus £10 per pupil). For GHPS&N this amount will be £16740 for the academic year 2020-2021. This money is ring fenced and must be spent on sport and PE. The plan below outlines the actions the school intends to take in order to promote and encourage good sports education and sustainable improvement in PE over time. The costs for each action will be added during the year / confirmed at the end of the year and an evaluation completed in July.
